The <u>WEDNESDAY WORD</u> this week is of course LENT. In Luke's Gospel (4:1-13) we hear the story of when Jesus went into the wilderness for 40 days and during that time Jesus relied on God's word to resist temptation.

Lent is a time for us to make an extra effort to listen carefully to God's word, to turn away from things that are wrong and to prepare for the celebration of Jesus's resurrection at Easter.



We are encouraging your children to do something 'extra for their faith' during the next 40 days and we hope parents will encourage this at home too. Fasting, Charity and Prayer are always the focus of Lent and we hope that doing these 'extras' will develop our children's increased sense of spirituality and love for the Lord.
